place at our eight summer camp ministries here in BC.

Like Jeff, half the 3500 children who came to our camps come from homes where going to church is not part of family life. And even for those who may have a church down the road, they have never or rarely darkened the door of those churches.

Over 300 of those children, when they heard the message of the gospel chose to seek out their cabin leader or chapel speaker to receive Christ as their personal Savior.

Jeff has been returning to our Bible Camp in Beaverdell for three years now. This year, he came to me again, unsure of the reality of his past decision. And so we sat again on the steps and I shared verses with him to remind him of the reality of his decision to follow Christ.

Many campers return to camp year after year. Over 600 this summer, like Jeff, were counseled to bring them assurance of their salvation or to renew their commitment to walking with Christ.

Pray that the Word of God will remain firmly planted in these young hearts and that God will sustain them in their new and growing faith.

Pray as well that as the camps seek to connect them with the local church that their parents will be willing to bring their children to church.

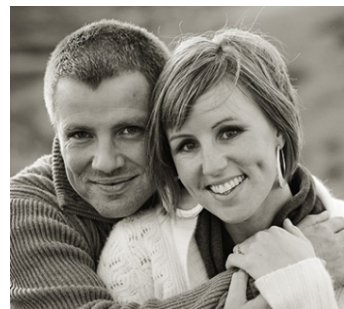

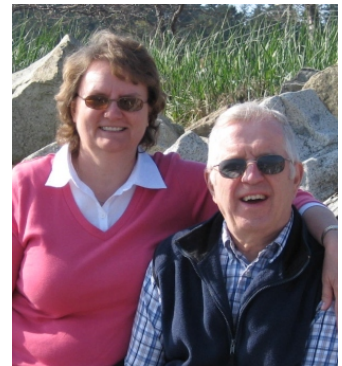
God's Answer for Hazelton

Albert and Judy are getting straight into ministry after only a month at their Hazelton post.

God spoke clearly to Albert at Lake of the Trees several years ago. He tells of praying by the lake one evening and suddenly being deeply burdened by the BC North and their need of the Gospel. Erv Bergman, who had asked Albert to speak at a family camp at that time, also asked him the next year if he would consider helping with a small CSSM church in Hazelton.

The Wurtzes traveled to that community in 2008 and spent the summer there. The concern for the community continued until Albert phoned two years later and asked about their pastoral need. The contacts there assured him they would like to have him return as a full-time pastor. In 2010 the CSSM BC accepted the Wurtzes as full time missionaries to serve at the Mount Rocher Church in Hazelton.

This definite calling of God was not without sacrifices. After settling business affairs and Judy resigning from her teaching job, they left their children and grandchildren behind and moved to Hazelton. Before they had even arrived, the Lord provided a house for them to rent in New Hazelton.

They are busy in the Lord's work and their constant prayer is for good contacts where they will be able to share the Gospel.

The Mission is blessed to have the Wurtz join them in reaching those with the least opportunity to hear of Christ. Pray for them and their outreach, asking God to protect them and lead them by His Spirit. Their heart's desire is to see people responding to the Gospel and then being rounded in their faith.
